

## WHAT'S IN YOUR EMERGENCY KIT?

<p>AN EMERGENCY kit contains essential items you and other members of your household may need during and after a severe storm. Your emergency kit should be able to sustain you for at least three days in case essential services have been isolated by floodwater. The following basic items should be included:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Your home emergency plan, including emergency contact numbers.</li> <li>▪ Portable radio (with batteries or wind-up)</li> <li>▪ Torch (with batteries or wind-up)</li> <li>▪ First aid kit</li> <li>▪ Sturdy gloves</li> <li>▪ Important documents and cash in waterproof bags</li> <li>▪ Essential medication</li> <li>▪ Special items for</li> </ul>	<p>Babies, the disabled, elderly or pets.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Drinking water and non-perishable food for three days</li> </ul> <p>If you live in an area that is prone to storms and/or floods, you may consider adding the following items to your emergency kit:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Mobile phone, spare battery and charger</li> <li>▪ Change of clothing and</li> </ul>	<p>shoes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Pillows, sleeping bags and blankets</li> <li>▪ Toiletries</li> <li>▪ Camping stove or gas burner</li> <li>▪ Valuables, photos and mementos in waterproof bags</li> <li>▪ Books and games for children</li> </ul> <p>Keep your kit in a waterproof box.</p>
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
